

## CLINICAL ROTATIONS II

**Code: 90029 Curricular Year 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester 6<sup>th</sup> Compulsory Credits: 1.0 ECTS**

### 1. CONTACT HOURS:

**Practical - 6 h    Seminars - 4 h    Tutorials - 20 h    Total - 30 h**

### 2. OBJECTIVES:

To enlarge student's exposure to "real" clinical cases at the Faculty Hospital; to develop a set of attitudes adjusted to work in a hospital environment; to improve oral communication skills and teamwork; to promote organizational abilities as well as to incur liabilities.

### 3. PROGRAMME:

**THEORETICAL:** 2<sup>nd</sup> cycle of seminars on Communication for Veterinarians (4 hours).

**PRACTICAL:** classes take place from Monday to Friday in 3-hour periods at the Teaching Hospital. The activities are planned for groups of 6 students. Each group must accomplish 2 periods of 3 hours per semester resulting on 6 hours/student/semester. The 6 students will follow closely three Hospital Departments: Hospital Consultation (N=2); Radiology and Diagnostic Imaging (N=2) and Internment (N=2). In each training session the three pairs of two students move round the three departments.

Classes taking place at the Isolation and Biological Containment Unit (UICB) of the Teaching Hospital, also take place from Monday to Friday, in periods of two hours, for groups of 4 students. Each student must complete 1 period of 3 hours/semester at UICB.

Students will keep up with teachers, practitioners and trainees activities and will perform basic procedures such as: (i) lead owners and animals to the consultation rooms; (ii) animal weighing; (iii) place pets on the examination table; (iv) animal handling; (v) body temperature reading; (vi) transport of biological samples to specific diagnosis laboratories; (vii) guide animal owners to the hospital reception; (viii) computer update of individual clinical files; etc.

**4. BIBLIOGRAPHY:** Handbook of veterinary communication skills (Gray C. and Moffett J., 2010).

Scientific articles, videos and presentations provided by the teaching team.

### 5. ASSESSMENT:

Each student is assessed according to the following criterion:

1. A written exam. Only students with 4/5 of attendance in practical classes are eligible for the final exam. Topics to assess will be those discussed at the seminars plus a short list of scientific articles;
2. It is required 100% assiduity on hospital shifts;
3. Each absence at a seminar will be penalized with 0.5 marks till a maximum of 1 mark.
